Bergholz Cemetery is located in the Springfield Township of Jefferson County. Specifically, it is located on the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 10, Track 12, Range 3. From Amsterdam, OH, on State Route 43. Turn north on to State Route 164 and continue for 3.2 miles. Turn left onto Elkhorn Road for less than 200 feet. Turn right onto Springfield Township Hwy 276. Destination will be on the left.

BORN: June 1753, County Down, Ireland (a) (b) (c) (d) (h)

DIED: 1845, Jefferson Co., OH (a) (b) (c) (h)

BURIED: Bergholz Cemetery, Jefferson County. • OR Located ¼ mile North of SR 164 (a) (b) (c) (e) (h)

General: Sea service PA Line {a) (b) (d) (g)

Specific: William Taylor was drafted in Philadelphia, PA and had Pennsylvania, Sea Service on the Schooner Sally out of Philadelphia, PA. He applied for his pension 24 Apr 1832 while living in Jefferson Co., OH, Pension number \$3755 (a) (b) (d) (g)

RESIDED: County Down, Ireland; Philadelphia, PA, until 1793; then moved to Bald Eagle On the Susquehanna River, PA for 2 or 3 years; then moved to Pittsburgh, PA for 2 years; then moved to Brooke Co., VA/WV for 6 years; and then moved to Jefferson Co., OR (a) (d)

WIFE: Catherine Askey (b) No other information available at this time.

CHILDREN: No information available at this time.

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: No information available at this time.
